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Signs of cerebral palsy

Unfortunately, sometimes an infant is injured through medical malpractice and develops cerebral palsy. If you think your infant might suffering from cerebral palsy, watch for these symptoms:

If your child younger than 6 months old:

- Her muscles feel too stiff
- Her muscles feel too floppy
- Her legs become stiff and cross when you pick her up.
- When you cradle her, she overextends her neck and back, as if pushing away from you.

If your child is older than 6 months:

- He only ever reaches with one hand while the other hand is in a fist.
- He can't put his hands together
- He doesn't roll over.
- He has trouble bringing his hands to his mouth.

If your child has any of these signs, you should bring them to the attention of your pediatrician immediately.

Not all cases of cerebral palsy are caused by medical negligence.
